Community Health Worker (CHW) Capacitation Transformation Project – Eli Bello, NDI	<p>Eli reviewed plan for CHW capacitation center. They were able to partner with CHW capacitation center at Multnomah County.</p> <p>Project scope: Train up to 50 CHW's and 4 "train the trainers". They were able to train 53 CHW's and 8 trainers in total. The project was also able to get funding from Providence and Oregon Community Foundation. They also conducted a 1 day CHW supervisor training. They will conduct another supervisor training in the next few months.</p> <p>Impact to community:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Highlighted CHW strengths in our community, also being more than healthcare specific. Many participants were employed already at local social service organizations. Powerful statements were made by participants regarding the impact on lives personally and in regards to doing advocacy. Worked with CGCC to develop mental health and chronic disease management advanced modules for training at the college. <p>Next Steps:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Future CHW trainings.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Funding is needed or fee for service model. Participation cost = \$1600/CHW for 90 hours, partial training. • CHW's are meeting monthly – 1st Wednesday at 12:00 in TD and HR to discuss trainings, resources, and shared ideas. • Dustin and Eli will connect regarding CHW application process. <p>Feedback to state for CHW certification: It is unclear as to whether documentation status plays a role in the certification process.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Requirements are: 90 hours, application, documentation, license, social security card, etc...
<p>Haven and Safer Futures – Courtney Galant, Haven, Gwen Paulson, Tara Koch, and Mercedes Hill</p>	<p>Coco reminded group that in our Community Health Assessment (CHA) 1 in 5 stated “I don’t know” to whether they have experienced domestic or sexual violence.</p> <p>Courtney Galant presented on Intimate Partner Violence (IPV). Results of Intimate Partner Violence can create various unhealthy conditions and can have an effect on the person directly involved or someone else in home, for example, kids. She also discussed the screening questions that are done at primary care physician’s office. 4 out of 5 people want healthcare providers to ask.</p> <p><u>Safer Futures Project</u> for Pregnancy and Parenting and Survivors: This program highlights three outcomes:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Training for Healthcare Providers 2) Technical assistance for universal screenings in the PCP offices 3) Onsite advocacy to link people in Haven’s services <p>Gwen reviewed the <u>hospital response program</u> for Sexual Assault: She explained it is a collaborative effort between Law Enforcement, Mid-Columbia Medical Center and Haven to address sexual assaults that present in the Emergency Department. The group had lots of concerns when learning that Wasco Co. patients under 15 years old who are victims of sexual assault need to travel to Portland for their care. Hood River Co has Columbia Gorge Children’s Advocacy Center which treats the needs of patients of sexual assault in Hood River County only.</p> <p>Courtney also reviewed <u>Haven’s Wellness program</u> that offers: yoga, trauma informed doula, food access, OHP assisters, free counseling, transportation, emergency housing, safety planning, violence prevention, and uses the sanctuary model.</p> <p>Future topic area to learn more about: How to address sexual assault for <15 in Wasco Co similar to how it is addressed in Hood River. Are there plans to do something different in the future? What’s the timeline?</p>
